

Security Policy

Each ship management office shall ensure ISPS code compliance for vessels under full technical management. Further, the ship management offices shall ensure that certain equipments required by the ISPS Code are available onboard.

Consequently, the WSM ship management has designated a Company Security Officer (CSO) responsible for developing, implement and maintaining the WSM ship management security program for the vessels under management.

WSM ship management has further appointed a Ship Security Officer (SSO) responsible for ensuring that Ship Security Plan and the preventive measures therein are implemented and maintained at all times.

The SSO is the primary point of contact between vessel and shore in relation to security issues.

Reviews, audits, inspection as well as training, drill and exercises will be conducted regularly to verify that all security assessments, plans and systems, as a minimum, comply with the international requirements and that security plans, procedures and emergency response plans are well understood and acted upon by the designated and other relevant personnel.

All employees must always be at alert in all levels of our organization - from recruitment, to vessel operations, to information management, to business dealings. The company shall promptly investigate and act on abnormalities that have an effect on security.

The master of the vessel has the overriding authority and responsibility to make decisions with respect to the security issues and to request assistance from Company Security Officer or any contacting government as may be necessary.

WSM shall actively promote security awareness at all levels of our organization through trainings, drills, familiarization process, and issuance of drills and reminders. Each business area head shall promote participation by all employees in the Security Management System through allocation of respective responsibilities, regular meetings, and feedback mechanism.

Trainings, drills, and exercises shall be regularly conducted onboard to verify that all onboard personnel have adequate understanding of the security measures and improve their security management skills.
